Cinematic Fun at Oceanside International Film Festival

Oceanside's rich connection to cinema includes the annual <u>Oceanside International Film</u> <u>Festival</u>, which is held each February and provides a venue for independent filmmakers to have their work screened along the vibrant North San Diego coast. Scheduled for February 18-22, the 2025 festival includes films from all categories and genres including foreign films, drama, animation, cause related issues, documentaries, and comedy, plus a noteworthy batch of student films. The Surf Film track is always a standout — aligning nicely with Oceanside's rich surf culture— and will include thought-provoking films like one about a surfboard crafted entirely from cigarette butts collected on the beach and a documentary from California Surf Museum Executive Director Jim Kempton that explores the artistry behind surfing through master surfboard shapers. The night is capped off by an epic cinematic surf film funded by Red Bull called "Creatures of Habit."

Lean into Joy and Discovery at the Oceanside Museum of Art

Oceanside Museum of Art (OMA) proudly presents their newest exhibit, <u>Marshall Toomey</u>: <u>Black Americana</u>, open now through April 13, 2025, showcasing the life, history, and artistry of Marshall Toomey, an accomplished artist and former Disney animator. Discover the impressive work of Toomey through his vibrant and authentic paintings, capturing moments in his life with a sense of vitality that makes them feel almost alive. Blending realism with character study, Toomey offers a fresh narrative of the Black American experience, celebrating everyday traditions and joy found outside of the struggle. During his 20 years working as an animator at Walt Disney Animation Studios, Toomey contributed to some of Disney's most beloved classics, including *Aladdin* (1992), *The Lion King* (1994), *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* (1996), and *Hercules* (1997). Explore Disney-reminiscent artistry that can be found in Toomey's pieces, sparking Disney magic in the least expected place.
